Location:	Public Safety Training Center, 5743 Skylane Blvd., Windsor, CA 95492. Directions and map with nearby lodging: PSTC Google Map Parking permits are required unless you have an E-plated vehicle. Permits may be purchased from vending machines in the parking lot for \$4 per day. Weekly permits for courses of one week or more can be purchased on the first day of class for \$5 per week. Cash or check only.		
Course Description:	This course fulfills the requirements of Section 832 of the Penal Code as mandated by the California Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) for agencies authorizing the use of firearms. Firearms topics covered are: care and maintenance, function, safety, shooting positions and fundamentals. *An accuracy test is required for successful course completion.		
Criminal History Check:	A criminal history check is required by state law (13511.5 PC) for non-law enforcement agency personnel. Information provided upon class reservation. PLAN AHEAD: A clearance is required on first day of class or you will not be allowed to participate.		
Ammunition:	450 Rounds required on day one. Only Training Center approved frangible non-lead ammunition in the original container is allowed. Details attached.		
Required Equipment:	Pistol in good working order in caliber of .38, .357, 9 mm, .40 or .45. Belt holster with safety retention device (no fobus holsters). Cleaning kit required.

College Application:	Please go to www.santarosa.edu . Click 'Apply Now'. Next, click on 'New or Returning Students Information' option. Scroll down and click on the 'CCCApply/Begin Application for Admission!' If you have not created an account in the last year, you will need to click "Create a New Account" otherwise, enter your Username and Password to "Sign In". Once your account has been created, return to the log in page and enter your user name and password to log in. Click "Start a New Application". Then click "Start Application". Choose the appropriate "Term Applying For". Be sure to select the semester during which you will be attending class. This is the College Application only. Registration for this specific course is not available online and will take place at the beginning of class. For "Educational Goal", it is essential for you to select 'Maintain Certificate or License'. Required Ammunition and Equipment

1. A quality and functional semi-automatic pistol or a quality and functional double action revolver. The only weapon calibers allowed in this course will be: **.38, .357, 9mm, .40, and .45**. There will be no .22 or .32 caliber weapons allowed. Any weapon which has an exposed hammer **shall have a decocking lever** or you will not be able to continue the class.
2. At least **three magazines** for your semi-auto or at least **two speed-loaders** for your revolver.
3. Magazine or speed-loader pouches for your belt.
4. ANZI certified eye and ear protection required (provided on range). It is highly recommended you bring your own personal ear and eye protection.
5. Suitable range attire – laced athletic shoes or boots required; no sandals or slip on shoes allowed.
6. Cleaning kit. One can be purchased at any sporting goods store, make sure it is for the same caliber as your weapon.
7. A quality holster capable of allowing you to re-holster with one hand. We will not allow you to attend this course without a quality holster. Please bring your holster with you the first night of class so that we can inspect it. No Fobus holsters permitted. No shoulder holsters, ankle holsters, cross draw holsters, fanny packs, holsters not specifically designed for your gun, holsters with an antiquated flap type retention device, holsters without some form of approved retention device strap or snap.
8. Only lead free ammunition is allowed to be used at the Junior College range. You will need **450 rounds of certified lead free frangible ammunition**, left in the original container. Do not bring any loose ammunition, it will not be allowed in the range. All ammunition will be inspected the first night and each day on the range. It is highly recommended, if you use remanufactured lead free frangible ammunition, you get at least one box of quality ammunition i.e. Winchester, Remington. Fiocchi or Federal lead free ammunition. If your weapon does not function with remanufactured ammunition and no other ammunition is available you will not be able to complete the course. **NO HOME LOADED** ammunition will be allowed on the range.
9. Make sure that your firearm and equipment are clean and functioning. We will not have the ability to work on your guns or equipment during this course. If your gun has performance deficiencies you may be asked to drop the class and take it another time.
10. Please **DO NOT** bring your gun into the classroom, but have it available on the first day of class, it should be left locked in your vehicle. You will not need it until the first range day.
11. Sharpie marker.
12. Range safety violations will be cause for immediate dismissal from this course. This will be at the discretion of the Range Instructor.

SHOOTERS: PLEASE NOTICE – Lead free, frangible ammo is available on a very limited basis. It is important you purchase your ammunition well in advanced of the class date to ensure you have ammunition.
