COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course fulfills the requirements of Section 832 of the Penal Code as mandated by the California Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) for agencies authorizing the use of firearms.

Firearms topics covered are: care and maintenance, function, safety, shooting positions and fundamentals.

*An accuracy test is required for successful course completion.

REQUIRED EQUIPMENT

Pistol in good working order in caliber of .38, .357, 9 mm, .40 or .45. Belt holster with safety retention device (no fobus holsters). Cleaning kit required. No single action revolvers or pistols are allowed. Please provide make and model of handgun you will be using for the class. Please bring at least three magazines and a magazine pouch for two magazines.

AMMUNITION

500 Rounds required on day one. Only Training Center approved frangible non-lead ammunition in the original container is allowed.
